Chair Campsall called the Public Hearing to order at 6:00 p.m.

**Chair Campsall stated that the purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive public input regarding Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1368-2020; Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1369-2020, Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1370-2020, and Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1371-2020.**

**CAO outlined the process for receiving public comment to the proposed Bylaws:**

**By-Law No. 1368-2020 Zoning Amendment**

**Zoning Amendment By-Law No. 1368-2020 proposes the following amendment(s):**

- (1) That Section 8.6.12 Specific Use Regulations is amended by adding:
  - c) Despite Section 8.6.12 a) a duplex is permitted on a fee simple lot for that part of Lot 2, Plan KAP91096, DLs 31 and 2139, Lillooet District, labelled Lots 2-13 on attached Schedule A, located in the Heron Ridge Road area..

**By-Law No. 1369-2020 Zoning Amendment**

**Zoning Amendment By-Law 1369-2020 proposes the following amendment(s):**

- (1) That Section 8.6.12 Specific Use Regulations is amended by deleting:
  - a) A duplex is only permitted as part of a bare land strata development; and

District Planner Joanne Doddridge spoke to both Bylaw 1368-2020 and 1369-2020 simultaneously as they are related. One inquiry was received regarding Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1368-2020, the inquiry was if the proposed homes would be seniors only or if they would be rentals. The proponent (Steve Mahon) was present and spoke to council that the properties would be fee simple properties and the target market is seniors but will be unable to stop rentals. Steve included reasons to support the request for fee simple lots. Fee simple lots allow for more greenspace, more energy efficient, less exterior maintenance, and more room for snow removal.

Mayor Campsall called for further input from those present – no further comment was forthcoming.

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### **Bylaw No. 1370-2020 Zoning Amendment**

(1) That Section 4.17.1 Home Occupation is amended by adding

- g) Personal service establishment, except for laundry and dry cleaning services.

District Planner Joanne Doddridge reported no written submissions or concerns have been received. The 100 Mile Fire-Rescue did want to comment that business in private residential properties are not subject to fire inspection with few exceptions.

Mayor Campsall called for further input from those present – no further comment was forthcoming.

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### **Bylaw No. 1371-2020 Zoning Amendment**

(1) That Section 4.16 Shipping Containers be amended as follows:

- a) Section 4.16.2 is amended to read:

In residential zones, one shipping container per parcel is permitted only on a temporary basis, **to a maximum of 2 years**, during active construction on the property, such construction the subject of a valid Building permit, provided the shipping container is removed within two weeks of the completion of construction or the expiration of the permit.

- b) Section 4.16.7 is deleted and replaced with the following:

Shipping containers are not to be used as habitable buildings or building components, unless professional involvement is provided.

District Planner Joanne Doddridge reported no written submissions or concerns have been received.

Mayor Campsall called for further input from those present – no further comment was forthcoming.

**Subject:** Wastewater Treatment Facility – Funding Application

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**During Asset Management Plan development; Administration requested True Eng. conduct a full review of the Wastewater Treatment facilities.**

**That review identified several facility improvements that should be undertaken in order to increase the useful life of the facility and increase its current efficiency.**

**One of the major issues identified was the sludge build up in the lagoons. The volume of sludge in the lagoons is impacting efficiency and its current useful life.**

**The Engineer's review recommends several tasks to be completed; including but not limited to:**

- A Upgrades to the Main Lift Station**
- B Blower Building Upgrades**
- C Aerated Lagoon Upgrades (Sludge Removal)**
- D Replacement of Aerator Membranes**
- E SCADA System Improvements**

**Class D estimates for the project is \$1,250,760 inclusive of engineering and contingencies.**

**The Grant program will contribute up to 73.33% of project costs – the District would be responsible for the balance of project costs (\$335,000).**

**Administration recommends the District indicate that our contribution be \$500,000 to the project; which is more than required.**


**Experience has demonstrated if applicants are able to increase their financial commitment, above minimum requirements, likelihood of a successful application is enhanced.**

**Subject:** Horse Lake Bridge – Load Restrictions

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Over a period of 18+/- months during **2013** and **2014** Horse Lake Bridge was subject to an engineering review in support of Load Rating (Apr '13 & Oct '13) and a follow up Condition Survey was completed in Oct 2014.

The key findings/recommendation being:

- “The existing bridge structure is in reasonable condition for its age and might be kept in service for some time with increasing maintenance and repairs; however, the bridge structure might reasonably be replaced with a more modern structure conforming to current design requirements providing increased load carrying capacity, increased safety, decreased maintenance requirements and extended service life”.

The District did increase its maintenance frequency for the bridge, primarily the surface structure. The decking was replaced on two occasions since 2014 at a cost of approximately \$100,000+

Again in **2015** the District had a structural review for the HL Bridge completed by West Edge Engineering (WEE). The conclusion/recommendation from that report being:

- “It is WEE’s understanding that the District of 100 Mile House is planning to keep this bridge in service another 5 years. WEE is of the opinion that under current condition, all the “hollow core” structural members still have adequate capacities to resist the design loads. However, ongoing deterioration of the timber section may push the critical pile in Pier 1 to its capacity limit within 5 years. Therefore, it is recommended that the critical pile in Pier 1 be reinforced with two ¼” bent plates around the perimeter. On the other hand, WEE is of the opinion that the critical pile in Pier 2 need not be reinforced due to the large capacity reserve in it. There is also no need for reinforcement with the other hollow core members because of low forces or insignificant locations.”

In the fall of **2019**, the District had WEE conduct a follow up review of the HL Bridge with the following conclusion/recommendation:

- “Based on the review, WEE is of the opinion that the overall bridge structure is still adequate for “**community traffic**”. However, while the bridge deck structure is still in acceptable condition, certain individual “hollow core” piles may not have sufficient capacity for commercial traffic such as logging trucks. Although occasional logging truck traffic would not likely cause immediate structural failure.

To avoid overloading of the bridge, WEE recommends that a load limit of 4,000 kg (9,000 lbs) gross vehicle weight be applied to the bridge. It is recommended that a load limit sign be placed on both ends of the bridge facing oncoming traffic.

We expect that the bridge will be safe for community traffic for 3 years with the load limit implemented, given that the structural condition of the bridge be reviewed every 12 months. Also, it is possible to extend the bridge service life by a few years by reinforcing certain critical structural members.”

After the **2019** review the, District requested a targeted structural analysis with a view to establishing safe load limits for the HL Bridge. That review and recommendation is hereto attached for information. Of note in this **January 2020** report the weight limit is established at 13,620 kg (30,000 lbs) gross weight and 10,900 kg (24,000 lbs) rear axle load.

Over the past few months, we have engaged highways (MOT/CVSE) for comment. We also discussed with our insurers and legal counsel.


It is clear to staff that the District cannot ignore the engineering recommendations once we become aware of any issues associated with the HL Bridge.

We also advise, Administration instructed District engineers to apply to the upcoming Build Canada Infrastructure intake scheduled for October 2020; to replace the HL Bridge. If approved, it is unlikely we would see the bridge rebuild until the summer of **2022**.

In the meantime, it is our intent to proceed with placing recommended weight limits on the bridge as per the WEE recommendations.

**Re: Vehicle Weight Limit for Horse Lake Road Bridge in 100 Mile House, British Columbia**

As requested, *West Edge Engineering Ltd.* (WEE) undertook a structural analysis to determine the vehicle weight limit for the Horse Lake Road Bridge in 100 Mile House, BC.

The structural analysis mainly focuses on the deteriorating timber piles especially the "hollow core" pile in Pier 1 (the 1<sup>st</sup> pier from the town side). The pile capacity under current condition and the predicted pile capacity after 5 years were calculated. The analysis suggests that the bridge structure will be adequate for H15 vehicles (30,000 lbs gross vehicle weight and 24,000 rear axial load) for the next 5 years.

Therefore, we recommend that a vehicle weight limit of 13,620 kg (30,000 lbs) maximum gross vehicle weight and 10,900 kg (24,000 lbs) maximum single axial load be applied to the bridge. It is recommended that a load limit sign be placed on both ends of the bridge facing the oncoming traffic. We expect that the bridge will be structurally safe for 5 years with the load limit implemented, given that the structural condition of the bridge be reviewed every 12 months. 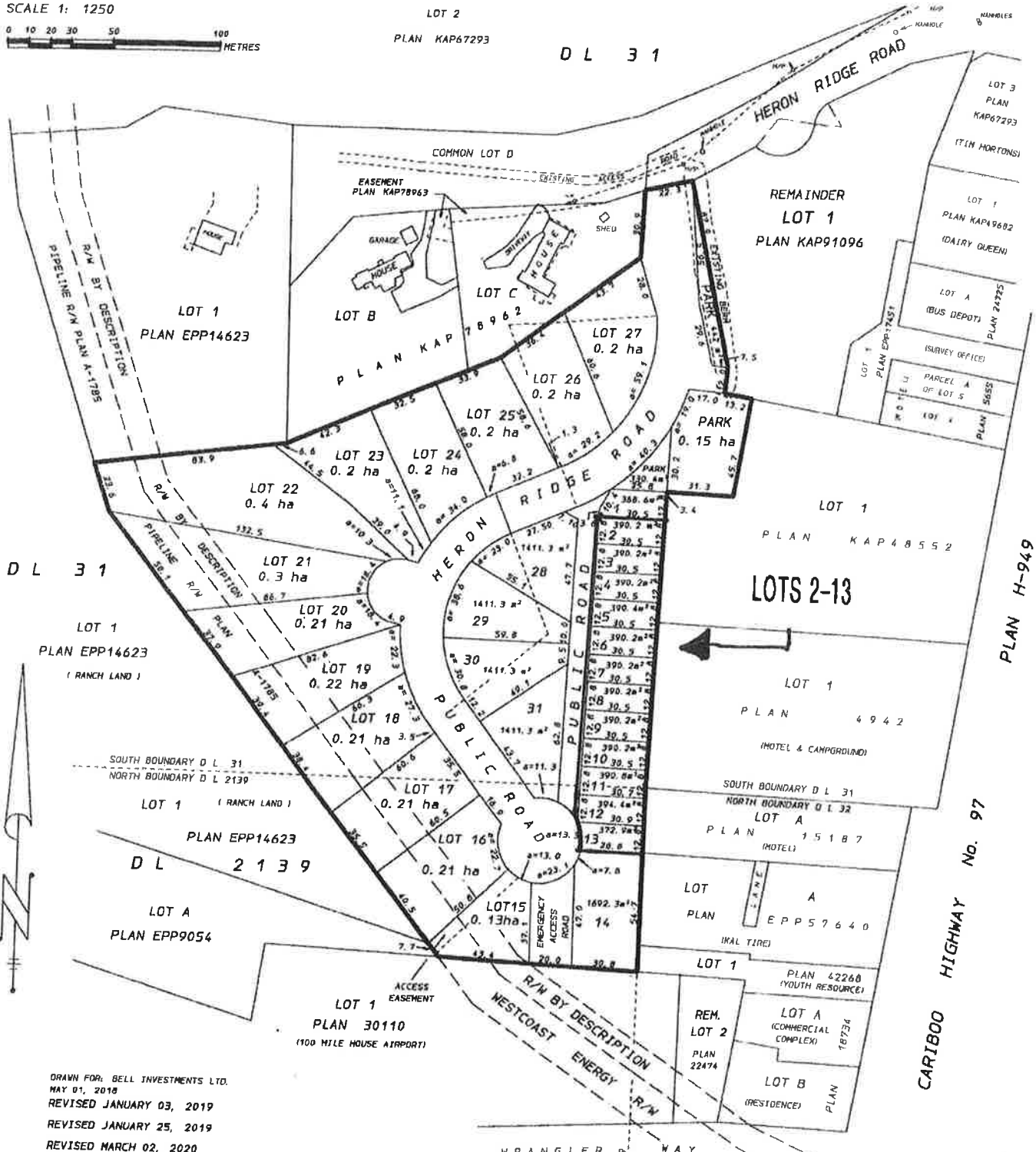

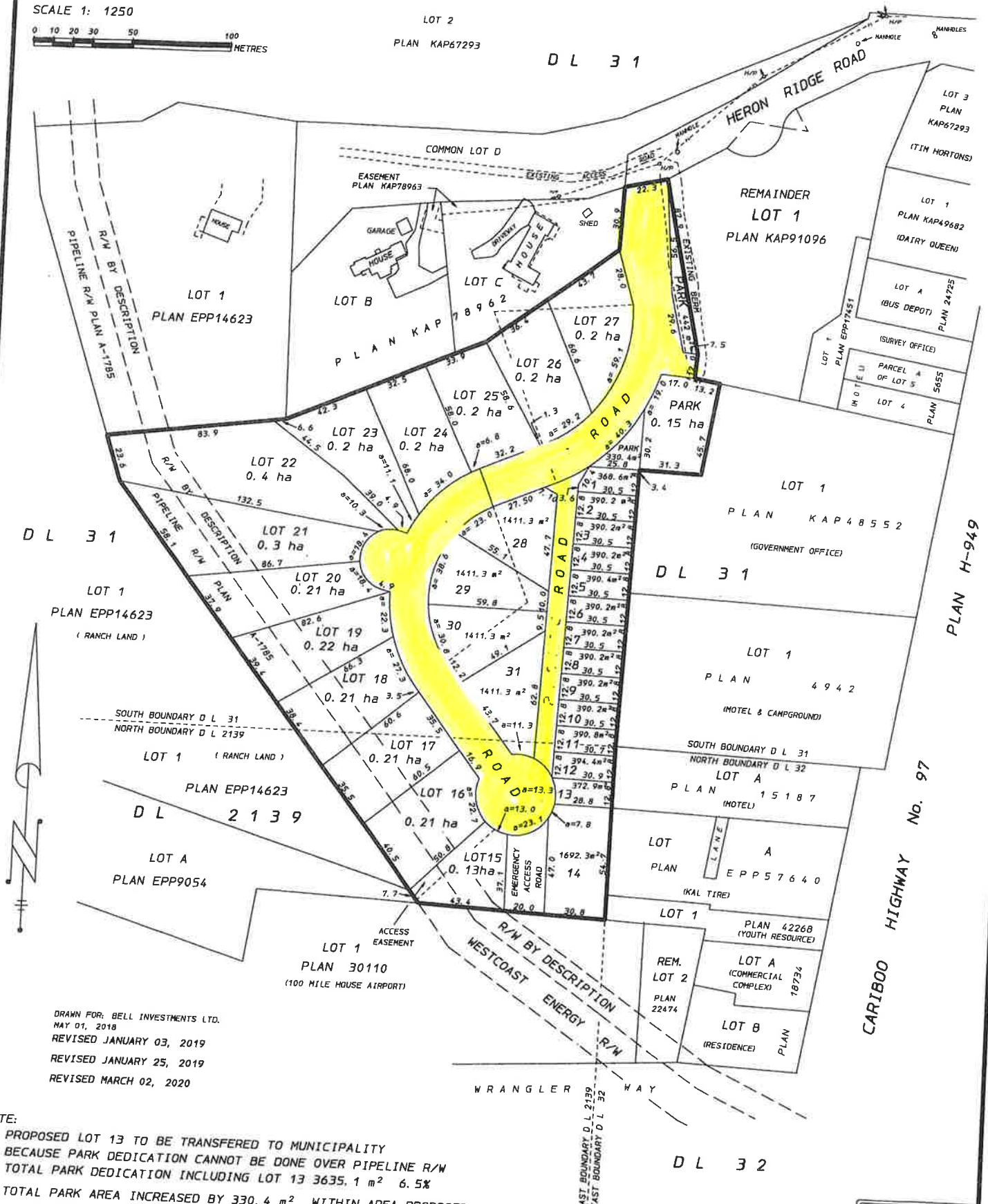

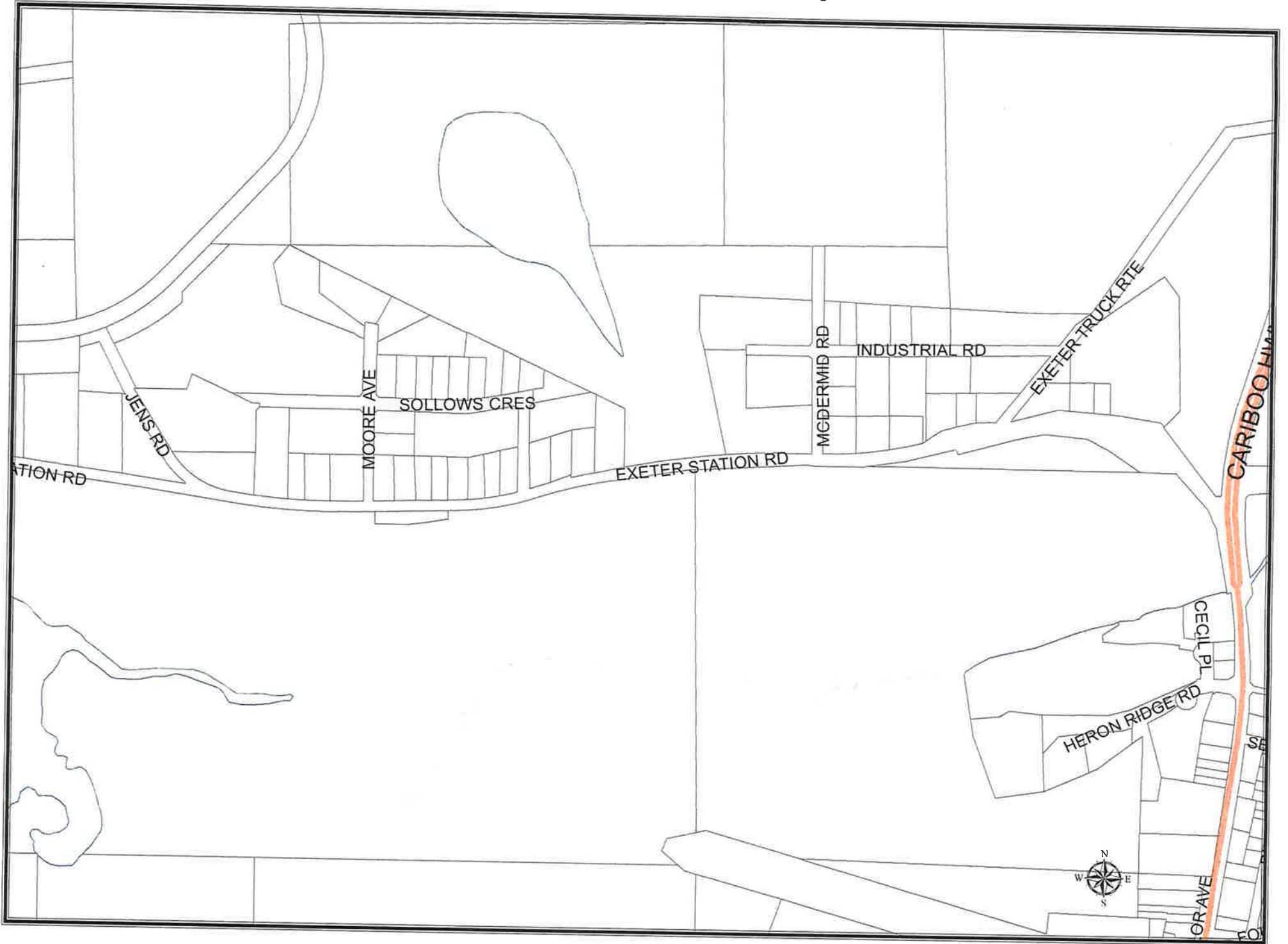

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### 7.4 ROAD NAMING

#### **PURPOSE**

To provide a framework for the assignment of new street names in the District of 100 Mile House.

#### **PROCESS**

Council will consider names for unnamed / new roads within the District, as follows:

1. Upon written request from developers, community groups, individual citizens, etc. Suggestions for new road names are encouraged and will be considered.
2. At its own initiative, should a road require naming or renaming.

#### **Guidelines for Selecting New Road Names**

Council will consider the following guidelines when naming new roads:

1. Roads will be named in accordance with Road Naming Bylaw No. 1225, 2012.
2. Precedence will be given to keep the name of the road in the same theme as the surrounding roads (i.e. tree theme).
3. Names with local historical significance will be of primary consideration.
4. Road names will not be duplicated within the community, within the jurisdiction of the surrounding Cariboo Regional District, nor within the 911 boundary dispatch area.
5. An appropriate street name suffix will be used.
6. If a named road exists at one side of the street, that name should apply to any extension directly in line with it across the intersecting street.
7. North-South and East-West designations will be avoided as much as possible. Where not possible to avoid, the road name will be preceded by the directional designation and thereby form part of the road name (i.e. North Birch Avenue, not Birch Avenue North).

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8. Generally, roads running North-South will be designated as “avenues”, roads running East-West will be designated as “streets”, and roads within the peripheral neighbourhoods of the community, or of rural character may be designated as “roads”. Other designations will be considered as appropriate.

Council will take into account the above guidelines when choosing road names; however, the final decision regarding any and all road names will remain at Council’s sole discretion and may or may not reflect the above principles in whole or in part.
