Our Past

Before the gold rush, 100 Mile's history can be traced back to the days of fur trading. From 1862 to 1870, over 100,000 people traveled the Cariboo Waggon Road into the Cariboo, making the community a hub for supplying the gold rush. As the rush subsided, ranchers moved in, and the area became a vital part of British Columbia's agricultural industry. Other industries, such as forestry, also prospered and we developed into a service centre with a diverse economy.

100 Mile House was named because it is located 100 miles from the start of the Gold Rush Trail.
