Please find attached a Development Variance Permit (DVP) application from Dennis Smith for the property located at 438 Birch Ave, legally described as Lot 1, Plan 29403, except Plan KAP44592, DL 32, Lillooet District.

The DVP application requests Council's consideration to vary the parking requirement under Zoning Bylaw 1290, 2016, s. 5.0, Tables 2 and 3 (attached), which specifies:

Table 2 – Offices require 1 parking space per 30 m2 of gross floor area

Table 3 – Assembly Use requires 1 parking space per every 5 seats or 10 parking spaces per 100 m2 of public assembly area, whichever is greater

The applicant wishes to convert the building from all office space to some office and some assembly use. This changes the on-site parking requirement. Based on the square footages provided by the applicant, the new space configuration would require 27 parking spaces. The property currently has 16 spaces.

The application has been referred to affected agencies and municipal departments. To date, several comments have been returned with no objection in principle. Any additional referral comments received will be brought forward at the Council meeting.

Should Council be in favour of the application as presented, the following resolution would be in order:

RE: Parking Variance Application

Further to our application, we are hoping to establish our congregation, in the "Peter Messner" building. My Son Kenneth did his training and article work with and under Peter to attain his Law Degree and License. After a few years, Kenn went on his own across the road, and Peter came and asked if he would like to buy the building. As Kenny and I considered, we thought it would be an excellent place for our church "New Wine" to call the lower portion home. At the time we had about 20 to 25 people all together with children and adults. The need is now to accommodate the parking, and because we have our main service on Sunday morning, when the town is on a rest, we were hoping we could have counsel to consider the parking requirements, to be amended for The Sunday morning worship service from the 16 units we have now for parking, and allow us to have an occupancy of up to 70. The offices are not in use on Sunday or Saturday for that matter, and the off road, as well as on road parking along with other closed business would be all that we require for the 2 hours or so, on Sunday mornings.



Enclosed is an application from Cask and Cleaver Brewing for a change of hours of liquor service. The proposal is to change liquor service hours:

FROM: 10 am – 8 pm Mon-Thurs

10 am – 10 pm Fri – Sat 10 am – 7 pm Sun

TO: 10 am – midnight Daily

The Cask and Cleaver is located at 175 Cariboo Hwy 97, and the property is zoned C-2, which allows for the current brewery use.

Surrounding land uses include: 7-11 / Petro Can to the north, Chevron to the south, Rosewood Building (mixed service and retail) to the east, Tim Horton's and Dairy Queen to the west.

The nearest proximity to other uses are:

Residential Heron Ridge, Sandhill Crescent, Cecil Place

Institutional Service BC, Community Hall, 100 Mile Elementary, Martin Exeter Hall

Liquor & Cannabis Retail Lakewood Inn, BC Liquor Store

Council must gather the views of residents and businesses that may be affected by the amendment to an existing liquor licence. The Public Hearing was advertised in the 100 Mile Free Press on Dec. 29, 2022 and Jan. 5, 2023 and on the District's website beginning on Dec. 29, 2022.

Notification letters were sent and/or delivered on Dec. 22, 2022 to property owners and known tenants within a 60 meter radius of the subject property.

To collect the views of residents that may be impacted by the application, the District will hold a Public Hearing in accordance with District of 100 Mile House Liquor and Cannabis Licencing Policy. In addition, Council must consider and comment on the following in determining whether the license amendment should be issued:

- the impact of noise on nearby residents;
- the impact on the community if the application is approved;
- the views of residents and a description of the method used to gather views;
- the local government recommendations (including whether or not the application is approved) and the reasons on which they are based.

Council may consider the following criteria when determining community impact:

- location of establishment
- proximity of establishment to other social or recreational facilities and public buildings
- proximity of establishment to other similar establishments
- occupant load and hours of operation
- traffic, noise, parking and zoning
- population, density and trends
- relevant socio-economic information
- applicant's security plan
- overall business proposal
- any other criteria that Council considers relevant

A sample resolution is attached for Council consideration.

WHEREAS Cask & Cleaver Brewing has applied for a Change of Hours of Liquor Service FROM 10 am to 7 pm, 8 pm or 10pm depending on the day of the week, TO 10 am to midnight daily; and

- > The location of the establishment is in a commercial highway corridor, zoned C-2, and is removed from nearby residences; and

Cask & Cleaver Brewery Ltd, owned and represented by Neale WARD and Daniel BRAATEN, is applying to have the current licensed service hours changed from the existing limited hours to 1000hrs-0000hrs (midnight) daily. This change would allow for more flexibility with the seasonally changing demands of service for our quality crafted food and locally brewed beer for locals, travellers and vacationers alike.

The location of Cask & Cleaver is at 175 Cariboo Hwy, across the highway from the Tim Hortons and beside 7-Eleven/PetroCanada. 





BC Assessment – Permissive Tax Exemption Case Law

At the December 13th Regular meeting Council put forth a motion to *direct staff to* inquire to BC Assessment if AB 2003 AA08 v. Royal Canadian Legion North Shore #118 et al is still current case law on the subject.

We reached out to a BC Assessment senior appraiser, provided the context of the referenced case law and we received the following response via e-mail:

I was able to look into this a bit more, and determined that there has not been a precedence setting decision since the one attached, however, there has been a re-interpretation of the Community Charter legislation and it's intent regarding permissive exemptions. The most recent direction we have received was in 2017; the direction was that under Section 224 (a)ii and (b)ii the intention of the legislation is meant to provide a broader spectrum for Local Government to pass permissive exemptions.

- 224. (2) Tax exemptions may be provided under this section for the following:
 - (a) land or improvements that
- (i) are owned or held by a charitable, philanthropic or other not for profit corporation, and
- (ii) the council considers are used for a purpose that is directly related to the purposes of the corporation;
 - (b) land or improvements that
- (i) are owned or held by a municipality, regional district or other local authority, and
 - (ii) the council considers are used for a purpose of the local authority

Under these sections it is the municipality that completes their due diligence to ensure they are satisfied that the space is "used for the purpose of the corporation/municipality". The onus is on the municipality to ensure all sections of the Community Charter are considered before passing a permissive exemption by-law. As such, BC Assessment would apply the permissive exemption as written and not make any further determination regarding the appropriateness of the exemption. The municipality may pass an exemption bylaw, under these sections, regardless of actual use or classification, as they see fit. A good number of municipalities have opted to only exempt portions of these properties that are not in class 6, but that is at their discretion.
